









- 3 modern, welcoming, modular **amphitheatres**: 300 – 900 - 3,000 seats





Public transportation network

- > 3 tramway lines
- > over 100 bus routes

Convention Centre from Airport & TGV station

- > Airport less than 30 minutes with Rhonexpress
- > TGV station less than 10 minutes



Bicycle access

- > Unique in Europe at such a scale, Vélo'V offers, on a self-service basis, a fleet of more than 4 000 bikes available throughout the city.
- > 6 Vélo'V stations are available in the Cité Internationale.
